Its Mission is to promote, establish, and equip individuals and schools committed to confessional Lutheran doctrine and a classical approach to education.

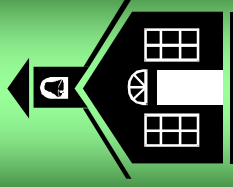
